Carnegie plans solar power station in Northam

Carnegie Clean Energy's expansion is continuing with plans for a 10MW solar power station in Northam which the Michael Ottaviano-led company will build, own and operate.

Carnegie said it would run the plant, which will be "battery-ready", for at least the next 25 years in what would be a demonstration the company could solve energy problems "from construction through to the sale of clean power".

The plant's 34,000 solar panels will produce the energy used by 3800 households.

It will cost up to \$20 million. Carnegie is yet to nail down funding.
