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Carnegie to install Delamere microgrid



Carnegie Clean Energy has won a contract to design, construct and install a solar, diesel and battery energy storage system microgrid at Delamere Air Weapons Range in the Northern Territory of Australia.

The hybrid power system will supply high penetration solar power to 200kVA peak load and deliver a 61% diesel consumption savings.

This project will be the second Department of Defence contract for a renewable energy hybrid microgrid system, following on from the Bathurst Island project that subsidiary Energy Made Clean delivered in 2015 for a 35kVA peak load system with remote monitoring facilities.

The project is due for completion in mid-2018.

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
